

Purpose of the Conference

The course is based on the End-of-Life Nursing Education Consortium (ELNEC) model.

The End-of-Life Nursing Education Consortium (ELNEC) project is a national end-of-life educational program designed to enhance palliative care in nursing.



Symposium Objectives:

- Discuss issues surrounding death and dying and the role of the interdisciplinary team in providing quality care to patients facing a life limiting illness.
- Identify key ethical issues and legal concerns impacting end-of-life care and decision making.
- Define the influence of culture in the care of patients experiencing a life limiting illness.
- Define importance of ongoing communication while caring for a patient with a life limiting illness.
- Define loss, mourning, grief, and bereavement and identify support systems used in coping.
- Identify barriers to adequate pain relief as well as therapies used at end-of-life for adults and children.
- Identify causes, assessment and management of common end-of-life symptoms for adults and children.
- Discuss the role of the interdisciplinary team surrounding death of a patient.
