#### 7 Important Disaster Preparation Steps

- · Be informed, stay up to date
- Have a plan and support network established before a disaster
- Establish your communication plan
- · Build emergency kits for your home and car
- Gather important documents
- · Practice your plan
- Plan for evacuation

### Important Documents to Have Located in One Place

(Preferably in a fire/water proof container)

- Doctor, dentist, pharmacy contact information
- Medication list
- · Banking and financial contact information
- · Credit card account/contact list and copies of utility bills
- Copies of driver's license, passport, medical/dental insurance cards, vehicle titles
- · Copies of homeowner, car & other insurance policies
- · Valuable pictures
- List of family contact phone numbers, email addresses & physical addresses
- · Household inventory with pictures
- Financial & medical power of attorneys, advanced directives
- · Mortgage or loan documents
- · Will, estate papers
- Place of worship location and contact information
- · Documentation of lock box location

#### **Home Emergency Kit\***

- Water (1 gal./day/person)
- · Non perishable foods
- Manual can opener/knife
- · Personal First Aid Kit
- · Battery powered flashlights/lamps
- Battery powered radio/weather radio
- · Extra clothing
- Cash
- · Solar chargers, extra batteries
- Disposable silverware, plates, dish soap
- Spray disinfectant
- Waterproof matches
- 3-5 day supply of prescription medicines and a current medication list
- Personal hygiene items
- Blanket
- Whistle
- · Face mask, hand sanitizer, disposable gloves
- Extra house/car keys, local street maps
- Paper towels, tissue, toilet paper
- Tarps, trash bags, food storage bags
- · Hearing aid batteries
- Emergency contact list
